



## Study Session: Charter for All 10-17 May 2015, European Youth Centre Strasbourg

Human Rights and Democracy: they are terms we often hear, they are at the core of our organizations and we want everyone to respect them. But what do Democracy and Human Rights really mean? How can we educate for them in our organizations? And how can we put these big words into practice?

At the IFM-SEI Study Session in Strasbourg, we will discuss these questions, share our methodology for Human Rights Education and Education for Democratic Citizenship, and think about how we can promote this kind of education in our organizations and beyond.

We will use the child-friendly version of the Council of Europe Charter for Human Rights Education and Education for Democratic Citizenship to inspire us and help us to improve our work for Human Rights and Democracy!

We are looking for motivated participants from our member organizations and other youth organizations who have experience of working directly with children or young people and will be ready and willing to multiply what they have learned by running HRE/EDC activities in their groups and in promoting HRE/EDC among other youth leaders on their return.

## **Objectives:**

- 1) To introduce Human Right and Democratic Citizenship
- 2) To introduce Human Rights Education and Education for Democratic Citizenship
- 3) To introduce the Charter on Human Rights Education and Education for Democratic Citizenship
- 4) To provide the space for participants to share good practices and challenges on Human Rights Education and Education for Democratic Citizenship
- 5) To learn how to plan and run Human Rights educational process
- 6) To familiarize participants with Compasito, the new Compass and Charter for All, and other existing tools, to ensure they become comfortable using them
- 7) To develop concrete plans to promote HRE/EDC in their organizations and beyond according to their contexts

Place: European Youth Centre, Strasbourg (France)

Costs: Participation fee of 50 Euro; Reimbursement of travel and VISA costs
