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Call for participants for our new e-learning course on:

"International projects, funding and intercultural learning"

We are excited to invite you to participate in a new e-learning course on the development of projects, identifying funding sources and intercultural learning, developed by participants of the 'On The Move' seminar.

'On The Move' is a project looking at issues of mobility, exploring the obstacles relating to visas, challenges facing young refugees and migrants, and ways to better involve them in our organisations.

Participants met in Vienna in June for the second seminar to explore the topic of regional youth work and specifically the development of projects, accessing appropriate funding and intercultural learning. Participants have now developed this e-course to share the skills and knowledge to multiply across our organisations.

Objectives:

- To understand internationalism and the role of our organisations and IFM-SEI on an international level
- To explore and understand the role of volunteerism in our organisations and the different aspects of volunteer work
- To learn the steps of developing a project, how to manage and overcome risk and undertaken an evaluation
- To identify and understand different funding options and assess their appropriateness for different project types
- To explore and understand intercultural learning and how it applies to international projects



Course format and timeline

The course will be delivered online via our learning platform over an eight-week period, commencing on 23rd October. Participants will make their way through one module per week, completing a combination of individual exercises and some group work and discussions. The course will take around one hour per week.

Languages

The course will be delivered in English, French and Spanish.

Requirements

We welcome participants from all regions and member organisations.

The course is open to participation from all levels and ages, whether new or younger members, trainers, board members or secretariat staff who would like to engage in a process of knowledge building and sharing around the topic. We hope to select a group that reflects this diversity, including regional, gender and language balance.

It is a requirement that participants commit to following the course each week and participating in group activity, as this is an important part of the learning experience.
