





Educational Resources








Help24 TeleHealth: Full-fledged online telemedicine services provided by qualified doctors. You can get the consultation of the right specialist, referrals for laboratory tests, ART for people living with HIV, HIV prevention services for key population groups (CGs), as well as the opportunity to get other services you need, regardless of your location and at a time convenient for time for you.

Trans"Generation: Database of friendly doctors for transgender people.

Dobrobud: Dobrobud provides walk in Mental health & psychosocial support to children and young adults who are internally displaced in Ukraine without any restriction.








Ukrainian National within Ukraine: Rokada provides support to internally displaced and war affected citizens.

Here's a quick list of organizations working in Ukraine that you can reach out to for other resources:

SD Platform: SD Platform are a Ukrainian NGO improving Ukrainian civil society by educating communities of their rights and potential abuses.

Gender Zed: A human rights organization that works with a broad range of issues such as sexual orientation and gender identity, overcoming stigma regarding LGBTQI+ community.

KyivPride: KyivPride is a Ukrainian non-governmental organization that aims at contributing to full respect for human rights for LGBT+ in Ukraine such as shelter, psychosocial support etc.

Kharkiv pride: KyivPride is the largest LGBTQ+ event in Ukraine, held annually in Kyiv.




Belgium

Assistance in Belgium: This site provides information on services available for Ukrainian refugees who have fled the war to Belgium. The Refuge Brussels: Brussels is a shelter and support structure for young LGBTIQ+ in a situation of family exclusion or in a state of homelessness.


Temporary Protection – UNHCR Poland: This site provides information about the temporary protection to displaced people from Ukraine.


United Kingdom




GERMANY

Vitsche Berlin: Ukrainian activist organization based in Berlin. Vitsche Berlin is LGBTQ-friendly. The organization is committed to inclusivity and diversity, which are central to its mission of fostering a strong and united Ukrainian community in Berlin, especially amid the backdrop of the war. Vitsche Berlin's events and activities often focus on creating safe spaces for all individuals, regardless of sexual orientation or gender identity. Handbook Germany: This is a website that provides information for people who want to migrate to Germany including for LGBTQI+ refugees from Ukraine such as migration, asylum, housing etc.

LGBTQI+ Community safe spots in Germany: This German website has compiled a total of 1,027 bars & cafés, plus 362 dancing spots and various shops and advice centers in 292 cities for Germany, Austria and Switzerland.






GERMANY

Munich Kyiv Queer: sees itself as an interface between Munich and the community in Kyiv as well as other Ukrainian cities; we initiate, mediate, design, coordinate and implement projects alone or together with the groups and associations of the respective cities. Queer Refugees Support: This is an open action group founded by queer people in Hamburg primarily to support queer refugees. Other queer immigrants – whether documented or not – are also welcome to contact us.





GERMANY

Praxis ohne Grenzen: Free medical treatment for people without

insurance.

Deutsche Aidshilfe: Organisation providing health care information and insurance to LGBTQI+ migrants, refugees and asylum seekers. Schwulen Beratung Berlin: To find specific social, legal, medical and psychotherapeutic services. AIDS-Hilfe Hamburg: Self-help association, civic movement and professional counselling organisation regarding HIV and health.

Andocken - Doctors for undocumented immigrants: Medical help and social counselling via the charitable organisation of Protestant churches (Diakonie).
